

# 2023 Annual Report on Florida's Merchandise Trade

Top 50 Trade Rankings & World Region Analysis

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## Executive Summary

The Merchandise Trade data series (also known as district-level trade data), published by the [U.S. Census Bureau](#), measures the nominal value of goods entering or exiting the United States *through Florida's seaports and airports*. This may include goods that are produced, grown, or mined in Florida as well as goods from other states and countries that are shipped through Florida. Merchandise trade figures demonstrate Florida's pivotal role as a **gateway to Latin America**, the Caribbean, and the southeastern U.S.— a true nexus of western hemispheric trade.

The **State of Florida** facilitates international trade in numerous ways, notably by supporting critical infrastructure, with more than half a billion dollars in seaport and aviation investments in fiscal year 2023-2024. Such investments protect the state's supply chains and maintain vital state competitiveness. As the State of Florida's international trade and investment promotion agency, **SelectFlorida** promotes exports in [target sectors](#), including aviation & aerospace, life sciences, and information technology. SelectFlorida assists Florida companies interested in exporting by providing them exposure to foreign markets through international trade shows or export sales missions and other services, contributing to job creation, industry diversification, and economic growth measured in these statistics.

In 2023, Florida's **total merchandise trade** (exports plus imports) reached **\$191.3 billion**, an increase of 0.7 percent in two-way trade over 2022. Florida outperformed the U.S. over this period, where total trade fell by 3.9 percent. The state's total trade has not only rebounded since 2020 but grown by an additional 25 percent since 2019. Among Florida's top trade markets are Brazil, Chile, Colombia, and the Dominican Republic. More than half of Florida's bilateral trade is with its most important trading region: Latin America and the Caribbean. Overall, Florida has bilateral trading relationships valued at more than \$1 billion each with 40 countries. The top commodities by dollar value entering or exiting Florida's seaports and airports in 2023 were automobiles, aviation parts, phones, computers, and organic chemicals.

Florida's **merchandise exports** amounted to **\$86.6 billion**, decreasing marginally by only 0.6 percent in 2023. Since 2019, Florida's merchandise exports have grown by 20 percent. The leading destination for Florida merchandise exports, as a world region, is Latin America and the Caribbean, comprising nine of Florida's top ten destination countries and nearly three-quarters of Florida's merchandise exports. Brazil is by far Florida's leading merchandise export market, with more than \$17 billion of goods exported in 2023, accounting for nearly 20 percent of the state's exports. The leading export commodities by dollar value passing through Florida's seaports and airports were aviation parts, phones, and automobiles.

Florida's **merchandise imports** were valued at **\$104.7 billion**, increasing by 1.8 percent in 2023 and 29 percent higher than 2019. Merchandise imports from Brazil and Mexico have seen double-digit growth in 2023, partly due to nearshoring trends. As a world region, Florida imports more from Latin America and the Caribbean than any other region, accounting for 37 percent of Florida's merchandise imports, with Asia and Europe also serving as major import markets. The top import commodities by dollar value passing through Florida's seaports and airports were automobiles, organic compounds, and phones.
