### **Executive Summary**

The State Origin of Movement data series (**Florida-Origin Exports**), published by the <u>U.S. Census Bureau</u>, measures the value of exported goods grown, mined, manufactured, assembled, or otherwise having value added in Florida (i.e. goods "Made in Florida"), regardless of where the goods exited the United States. These data provide an indicator for Florida producers and manufacturers about the state's production capacity of certain goods.

The State of Destination data series (**Florida-Destination Imports**), also published by the <u>U.S.</u> <u>Census Bureau</u>, tracks the U.S. state, territory, or possession for which foreign-made goods are ultimately destined, regardless of where they enter the United States. These data are an indicator of market size for foreign producers from a given country or in a particular industry sector.

The **State of Florida** facilitates international trade in numerous ways, notably by supporting critical infrastructure, with more than half a billion dollars in seaport and aviation investments in fiscal year 2023-2024. Such investments protect the state's supply chains and maintain vital state competitiveness. As the State of Florida's international trade and investment promotion agency, **SelectFlorida** promotes exports in <u>target sectors</u>, including aviation & aerospace, life sciences, and information technology. SelectFlorida assists Florida companies interested in exporting by providing them exposure to foreign markets through international trade shows or export sales missions and other services, contributing to job creation, industry diversification, and economic growth measured in these statistics.

In 2023, **Florida-origin exports** were valued at **\$68.9 billion**, an increase of 1.7 percent over 2022. The state's exports have not only rebounded since 2020 but grown by 23 percent since 2019. Overall, Florida ranks sixth among exporting states, with annual growth surpassing not only the U.S. but each of the top five states. Canada, Brazil, and Mexico are leading export markets for Florida-origin goods as more than 60 percent of Florida-origin exports are destined for countries in the western hemisphere. The leading commodities by dollar value of Florida-origin exports were aviation parts, phones, computers, automobiles, and medicaments.

In 2023, **Florida-destination imports** amounted to **\$112.6 billion**, a growth of 0.5 percent over the year and 37.8 percent since 2019. Florida ranks ninth among importing states and was one of only three states in the top 10 with positive annual growth while overall U.S. imports declined. Among the top sources for Florida-destination imports were Mexico, Germany, and Canada. Nearly 40 percent of Florida-destination imports are sourced from nations in the western hemisphere, with Asia accounting for more than 30 percent and Europe with 26 percent. The leading commodities by dollar value of Florida-destination imports were automobiles, phones, organic compounds, refined petroleum, and seafood.

Florida's origin/destination trade is particularly important when considering trade with **USMCA nations** (Mexico and Canada), since most of that exchange is cross-border trade, with goods transported by truck or rail accounted for in these data series. These data are also useful for **state comparisons**. However, Florida-origin exports and Florida-destination imports *cannot be added* in the same way that merchandise trade can be totaled, since Florida-origin exports and Florida-destination imports are two distinct data series with different data sourcing methodologies.
